

Key events marking Jane Austen 200 in Hampshire

Hampshire will be staging a year-long series of events across the county in 2017, to celebrate the creativity and talent of its most famous daughter, Jane Austen - who died 200 years ago on July 18, 1817.

Hampshire was Jane Austen's birthplace, as well as place where she was laid to rest. It was also filled with the people, landscape and the society which provided so much of the inspiration for her classic novels.

The Jane Austen Story, Winchester Cathedral November 11 2016, to December 31 2017

A permanent exhibition situated beside her grave in the north nave aisle of Winchester Cathedral. Read about Jane's birth and childhood in Steventon, the family's move to Bath, her return to Hampshire, adult life and her writing in Chawton and the final few weeks of her life and resting place in Winchester. http://janeausten200.co.uk/event/jane-austen-story

Mysterious Miss Austen, The Gallery, Winchester Discovery Centre May 13 to July 25, 2017

This showpiece exhibition will feature first editions of her work, personal letters and portraits from the National Portrait Gallery and unseen collections. In addition, Jane's pelisse coat is the only garment in the world with provenance that can be traced back to Jane Austen. This is the first time these important collections will ever have been displayed together.

Sitting with Jane Book Bench Trail, Basingstoke June 17 to August 31, 2017

An inspired sculpture trail. The 25 sculptures are all benches, shaped like an open book, and each is designed and painted by a professional artist in a style inspired by Jane Austen's life and times in Basingstoke, Steventon and the surrounding area. The trail and the associated app will give the opportunity to explore (and sit in) places and landscapes that were important influences on Jane's life and work - often undiscovered by visitors. Jane was born in Steventon, and Basingstoke was her local town for more than half her life, this trail will help to reconnect visitors with where she grew up and began her writing career.
